The plan of action conceived during the beginning of the academic year has been successfully initiated and completed accordingly in a time bound manner. 1. As a part of anti-ragging measures, posters and phone numbers of members of Anti-ragging committee have been displayed at various points. 2. Improvements in teaching methodology were made by holding multiple lectures cum demonstrations by faculty on patient care also by way of regular journal clubs, clinical meets and Bedside clinics. 3. A new reading room, fully air-conditioned has been made available to students round the clock.



Title of the First Practice – Improving Learning through an Integrated Diverse Programme (a) Goal: To provide Post Graduate medical students with a diverse programme involving all specialities and give them opportunities to interact with eminent personalities and faculty from other institutes of National and International repute. (b)Context: Academic curriculum is designed in such a manner so that there I integration of multiple personalities and methods of teaching. (c) Practice: Eminent speakers are invited for conduct of academic activities such as Guest Faculty lectures, clinical case discussions etc. Training programme is diverse by way of having lectures, workshops, CMEs, Symposia and on job training. Activities such as Poster presentations and Quiz are also carried out on a regular basis with the aim of being able to impart knowledge on vast number of subjects to the Post Graduate students. 2.
