

- 2. Out sourcing of Services for collection, transportation, treatment and disposal of biomedical Waste at INHS Asvini is considered mandatory as per present regulations of Bio-Medical waste Management Rules- 2016. Presently, the biomedical waste is being disposed off through outsourcing services by M/s SMS Envoclean Pvt. Ltd. for the period of one year w.e.f. - 01 Jun 20 to 31 May 21 which was further extended fourth for 03 months w.e.f. 01 Jun 21 to 31 Aug 21, 01 Sep 21 to 30 Nov 21,01 Dec 21 to 28 Feb 22 & 01 Mar 22 to 30 Apr 22. Since the present contract is valid upto 30 Apr 22 and there is need for continuity in these essential services for collection and disposal of Bio Medical Waste on a daily basis. Case for fresh contract for Biomedical was at HQWNC/SSO (Store) for approval of retendering. PNC was conducted on 31 Jan 22 at Jt IFA office and the firm was persuaded to reduce its offered cost further which the firm offered their final quotes @ Rs 63,01,123.40 from the previous offered quote of Rs 66,19,723.40. Further a Re-PNC was conducted at CLOGO/HQWNC on 14 Feb 22 with firm's representative and Jt. IFA. It was decided to opt for retender of the said case wherein the bid for consumables (Biodegradable bags and PPC containers) will be done separately to ensure conclusion of cost effective contract. The hospital is continuously generating considerable amount of Biomedical waste on daily basis, which is required to be immediately cleared off to ensure healthy environment. View no other alternatives available in hand, the case is being processed for further extension of 03 months or till conclusion of fresh contract to ensure continuity in services. Hence the said proposal alongwith the Statement of Case and relevant documents is forwarded herewith.

- 3. Compliance to the conditions as laid down in para 3.9 of DFPDS -16 is hereby confirmed as follows:-
 - (a) It is certified that there is no downward trend since the rates are according to the rate fixed by the Government of Maharashtra for 20 years.
 - (b) The performance of the seller is satisfactory.
 - (c) It is administratively convenient since there is only one authorized firm in the state and also the rates have been fixed by the state government for applicability to all hospitals.
- 4. M/s SMS Envoclean is the sole authorized company for collection and disposal of Bio medical waste (BMW) in Maharashtra and the rates has been fixed for 20 years by the state, hence it is proposed that the contract be extended for period of 03 months at the approved rates till conclusion of the fresh contract for BMW.

- 2. The point wise action taken report on observation vide para 2 and 3 of SIGNAL ibid is as follows:-
 - (A) (a) Regular Inspection is being carried out of the Liquid Oxygen plant and Stowage area for the oxygen Cylinder. All loose electrical wires have been concealed with casing/ capping. Two in number flame proof lights fitted. Renovation work for the Manifold Room is in progress with EDC 31 Aug 21. Inflammable materials have been shifted to the MES POL store.
 - (B) (b) The procurement of Oxygen monitoring system in hand.
 - (C) (c) Fitment of Alarm System for monitoring the threshold limit of oxygen in critical care areas in the hospital is being explored. No vendor has responded to queries.
 - (D) (d) A special repair work is under acceptance for fitment of additional exhaust fans as replacement of BER exhaust fans for improving ventilation in wards/ ICU/ Oxygen manifold room.
 - (E) (e) The existing Fire alarm system in the Main Hospital building is being replaced under ongoing AMWP Work. The cabling work for the same is over on 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th floor. EDC for the same is 30 Sep 21. In the interim 03 in no portable smoke alarms have been installed in ICU. The Fire Main System of the hospital is made 100% operational. Further, case for procurement of £0 in No ELSA sets and 20 in No BASCCA sets on TY loan is being pursued vide HQWNC Fax Message ibid.

- (F) (f) The operational checks of all the fire points and first aid firefighting equipment has been carried out. The pending demand first aid firefighting equipment have been received from MO (MBI) on 28 May 21. Additionally, 30 in no fire balls have been installed.
- (G) (g) All fire exits are demarcated for free evacuation routes.
- (H) SOP for the storage/ re-filling/ connection of the liquid Oxygen Cylinders is in place.
- 3 (A) (a) In house mock evacuation drills are conducted on a daily basis.
 - (B) (b) The oxygen storage areas and patient care areas having high oxygen usages are marked as No Smoking areas.


